## OVERVIEW OF THE STATE OF THE BRUINS ADDRESS

*Dear Bruins Families & Friends,*

*As the summer marches on Peter, Jen and I have been busy in the office with our summer tournament teams, camp preparations, our 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Golf Outing, Beantown Classic details and, most important, preparing for next season.*

*There have been some major **positive** developments over the last couple of months that we want to fill you in on as well as some other housekeeping items. Please take the time to read over the info in our “**State of the Bruins Address**”.*

### **1) New England Sports Center**

*We are very **excited** to announce that over the past two months we have worked on and closed a deal to go back into the **New England Sports Center** on a permanent basis*

*We will be moving our offices into NESCC. The offices will be located in between Rink 4 and Rink 5. We hope to be moved in by mid to late summer and we are also working on having permanent locker rooms for both full season teams. This is a huge step forward for the Junior Bruins family. This will allow us to better control our schedule, recruit and run our program from one central location.*

### **2) Junior Bruins AAA team update**

*Over the last few months we have been deciding on what direction we want to take with the Midget AAA team. We were approached by several Junior B leagues and looked at various midget options.*

*We took a hard look at the pro's and cons of remaining as a Midget team and becoming a Jr. B team. We have decided to join the Empire Jr. B League. The positives vastly outweighed the negatives. The name of the team is also changing slightly. The official name of our team and how it will be referred to is: Junior Bruins AAA.*

*The Empire League provides a better, more competitive schedule that will strengthen our schedule, provide additional exposure and allow us to compete for a National Championship. The two playoff finalists will go to USA Nationals March 30-April 2 in Philadelphia, PA.*

*While we are playing in a Jr. B league we also still fall under the classification of a Midget team (due to the age of our players) so we are able to continue to play in all the top Midget tournaments that we have done in the past. So, we will get the best of both worlds. We will play a stronger, more challenging league schedule yet still participate in midget tournaments such as the MA Select Labor Day Tournament, Buffalo Saints, Top Gun, Beantown Fall Classic, Shattuck's St. Mary's, etc.*

*Our game schedule is already done and has been posted on our web site calendar. Some specifics need to be ironed out (game times) but the schedule is posted. As you can see by the schedule online our travel will be similar to last year. We have worked to limit travel and part of the reason of joining the Empire was because our league games are local and limit traveling to find games in the winter months. We are really excited about joining the Empire and the benefits it brings to our players, team and program. Having two junior teams is a big plus for our organization and we are looking forward to the new challenges.*

### **3) Boston Little Bruins**

*In making the decision to have the Junior Bruins AAA team leave the EMJHL and move to the Empire we also decided to have the Little Bruins not participate in that league as well. The Little Bruins will continue to play in the EHF. The EHF schedule, like last year, is only 7-8 games.*

*Another benefit to leaving the EMJHL is that it frees up some weekends to schedule games with stronger teams. We are working on finalizing the EHF schedule as well as some non-league games. We have posted some of the Little Bruins schedule on the calendar.*

*Once our game schedule is set we will work on posting our practice schedule.*

### 4) *Junior Bruins*

*There have been no major changes to the Junior Bruins plans other than the move to NESC on a full time basis. The game schedule has been posted and we are working on posting the practice schedule.*

### 5) *Bay State Hockey Foundation*

*We have recently met with lawyers to start the process of setting up a not for profit arm of our organization. We have, for the last couple of years, been thinking of ways to help those who need financial assistance within our program and in the hockey world in general.*

*We have had various fundraising idea's (such as the Golf Outing) and having the Bay State Hockey Foundation (BSHF) set up will allow those who make donations have those monies be tax deductible. This will allow us to step up our efforts in raising money for those who are not as fortunate and could use some assistance.*

*Jen Brothers has also been instrumental in getting some scholarships set up from various vendors, friends and those in our program. We know that once the BSHF is formally registered with the state we will be able to become more aggressive in setting up scholarships and our fundraising efforts to help defray costs to our families.*

*We would like to set up 2-4 fundraisers throughout the calendar year. Our summer event would continue to be the Golf Outing while we would like to set up something in the winter as well such a Texas Hold 'Em tournament where all proceeds benefit the Foundation and winners would receive donated prizes. We have other ideas that we hope to implement over the next season.*

*Those that have experience in fundraising and would like to volunteer to help (in any capacity) are more than welcome. The bottom line with our fundraisers is to put all monies raised back into our program and to help those who need assistance. We never want finances to get in the way of a player participating in our program so the fundraisers and scholarships is are a way to give back and help alleviate some of the financial concerns families are faced with. There is a tremendous amount of wealth in our country and directing it to some whose needs are real can make a big difference in a player's life.*

### 6) *Team Gear*

*We put in a large order to get ourselves stocked for the upcoming season and beyond. The entire inventory is in (polo's, track suits, mesh shorts, jackets, bags, sweatshirts, etc.).*

*All "team gear" will be handed out at the Final Junior Camp in July for players on our three winter teams. We will also have "team gear" set up at the Golf outing for those who want to buy it there.
