### PROSPECTS

#### BLACK TEAM

#### Friday, May 6th:

The '90's started off in Toronto at the Prospects Tournament with the Bruins Black and Bruins Gold teams. The Black team started the day with an 8-2 win over TPHS. The first period started off slow with a 0-0 score. The B's came on strong and scored 3 quick goals in the second by John Henrion, Mike Thomas and Mike Destefano. Assists were from Steven Siego and Pat Mullane on Henrion's, Destefano on Thomas', and Toni Snyderman on Destefano's. Destefano had the GWG. TPHS scored a minute later but the '90's Black got two more by Henrion from Ryan Hegarty then Ryland Schwartz. The second period ended 5-1. Henrion scored another two in the middle of the third, both were SH. Schwartz had the helper on the second. Snyderman scored the final from Destefano. TJ Massie kept the scoring at two. In the afternoon, the Black team had a close game against the North Stars, but came out with the 5-4 win. Thomas scored the first two with Jeremy Gouchie having helpers on both. Casey Brugman helped with the first. The North Stars tied it up after the second 2-2, and took a 4-2 lead late in the third. Hegarty from Tom Freyre and Brugman had the third BJB goal. 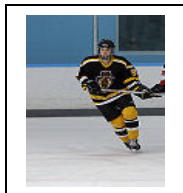

TJ Massie was excellent in net and earned the shutout. A few hours later in the quarterfinals, the Bruins Black lost 3-2 to Ontario Blues. The Blues were ahead 3-0 early in the third. Gouchie from Thomas and Brugman had a PPG. Then Henrion scored a minute later with assists from Mullane and Schwartz. The Blues, one of the tournament favorites, went on to win the 1990 Prospects title.

### Friday, May 6th:

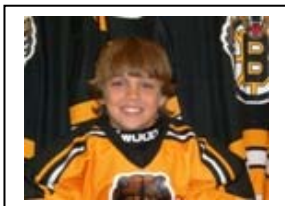
