For the second straight year and the fourth time since 2002, Maine is back at the Frozen Four. In order to reach the national semifinals this time around, however, the Black Bears have had to stage a comeback that would make Lazarus proud — that's a New Testament reference for you public schoolers.

After bursting out of the gate with a nine-game unbeaten streak and a 14-3-2 record through 19 games, Maine stumbled. The Black Bears lost 11 of their last 18, including four straight games at Massachusetts — one series ended the regular season, the other bounced Maine from the Hockey East playoffs and sent the team back to Orono to await their NCAA Tournament fate.

The Black Bears were given a reprieve, earning one of the last at-large bids into the NCAA playoffs. Seeded third in a wide-open East Regional in Rochester, N.Y., Maine dominated second-seed St. Cloud State in a first-round win, then avenged the recent losses to UMass by beating the Minutemen in the regional final.

Junior defenseman Bret Tyler, the team's leading scorer from the blue line with six goals and 20 assists in 39 games, contributed a goal and an assist in the Black Bears' regional final triumph. Inside College Hockey caught up with the Maynard, Mass., native at Alford Arena.

AAA TOURNAMENT SEASON AROUND THE CORNER

'07 Campaign Will Kick Off in Toronto

FRAMINGHAM, MA-Now that the 2006-2007 hockey season is in the Bruins' rearview mirror the organization now looks ahead and the 2007 AAA tournament season is less than a month away. The success of 2006 will be tough to duplicate as the Bruins' teams won 12 titles and had a winning percentage close to .800%.

The Bruins will send teams abroad to Toronto for the OTTF Spring Classic and the Prospects tournament. Montreal will see four Junior B's teams at the Warrior Montreal Meltdown. The Meltdown is the new name for what was the Mission Cup. A new tournament on the schedule will be the North American AAA Champions Cup in Las Vegas.

The Boston area rinks will also see Bruins teams at tournaments such as the Spring Fling, Icebreaker, Eastern Spring Showcase, Eastern Summer Showcase, Jr. Chowder Cup and the Midget Hub Cup.

The 1995 Junior Bruins will be the only B's team in Vegas. "We hooked up with a contact of ours in Vegas who is helping put the team together and got us involved out there. We hope the experience is a positive one and, if so, our plan is to bring several age groups out there in '08. It is a unique tournament in that there is only one game per day and games are 60 minutes long. Having only one game per day will let players and their families enjoy all that Vegas has to offer. It will allow families to take a vacation and mix in some strong hockey competition. The tournament field in Vegas looks to be solid," Chris Masters said.

"Our organization looks forward to this part of the year and these tournaments. We get to work with some of the top players in the country and play against some very talented teams and players," he continued. "It is also a time to catch up with players and families who have been with us in the past who we have not seen since last summer and we get to know our new players and their families. This year, while most of our players are from the greater Boston area, we have players from Florida, Connecticut, New York, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Ohio, Michigan, Florida, Alaska, Missouri, Colorado, Minnesota, California and Nevada. We may also have a player on one of our teams from China. We are excited for the tournaments to start!"

The first teams to get going are the '95 and '96 Bruins at the Prospects tournament.

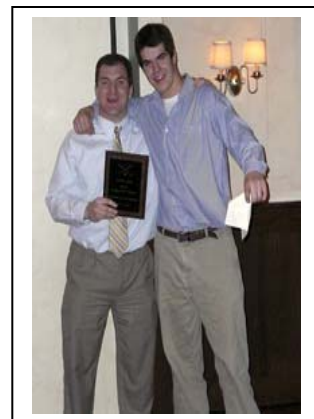

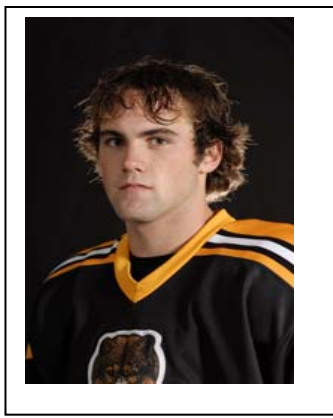
